	ANNEXTURE "A" VIEWS WITH REGARD TO IMPLEMENTATION OF UN RESOLUTION 73/46 ON WOMEN, DISARMAMENT, NON PROLIFERATION AND ARMS CONTROL Introduction: The United Republic of Tanzania being among UN member states takes into consideration all strategies and efforts to control proliferation of Small Arms and Light Weapons basing on Declarations, Protocols Treaties and Resolutions. Resolution 73/46 on Women, Disarmament, non proliferation and Arms Control was adopted by the General Assembly on 5 December, 2018 in which para 10 requires Secretary General to seek the views of member states on ways and means of promoting the role of women in disarmament, non proliferation and arms control.		

The United Republic of Tanzania takes this opportunity to address views which will enable women to participate in disarmament, non proliferation and arms control. Views towards implementation of the Resolution i. Each member state should have a national Action Plan for the preventions of illicit firearms and issues of women participation must be addressed therein. ii. Each member state should have an independent Firearms Control Department with full time staffs who among other things can involve women in illicit firearms control.

iii. Involvement of women in different government positions iv. Establishment of gender desk at police stations whereby women can report issues related to firearms which will help on disarmament, non proliferation and arms control. v. Establishment of sensitization programmes for women to report any criminal case which involves illegal use of firearms vi. Men who are in marriage should seek consent from their wives before they can apply for firearm licence.

vii. Member states should harmonize their National Laws to reflect the requirement of the Resolution.
